You will learn how and why to use the various exposure modes: Manual, Aperture Priority, Shutter Priority & Program. In addition, the different focus settings will be discussed and how each of them work. Also, learn how the wind plays an important part in getting the best shots. Finally, eagle etiquette, you will learn how to get the best images without stressing the birds.

At 1pm we will gather at L & D 14 to photograph these magnificent birds. Many photographers feel this is one of the **BEST** Eagle photo locations on the Mississippi River. Stan and other qualified QCPC members will be on hand to help with any questions.

PLEASE, dress warmly, and bring hot drinks if you wish - those Mississippi winds get chilly. Restroom facilities are available at the Dam. It will be a great day of learning and photographing the Bald Eagles.
